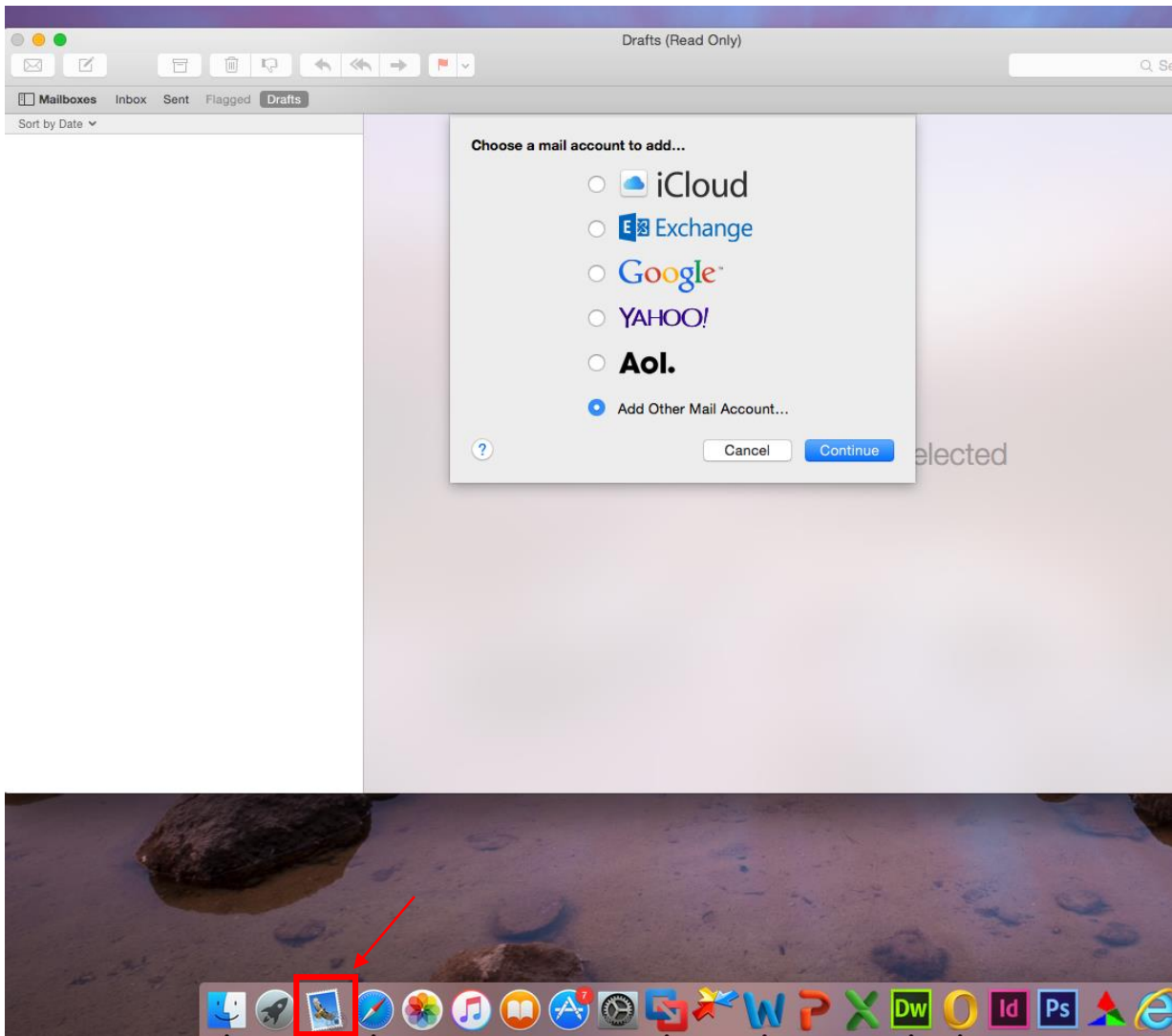


How to set up your email in a MAC

OS X YOSEMITE

On your desktop click on your **MAIL App**. Select **Add Other Mail Account...** then click Continue.



In the Next window, enter your Name, Email Address and Password. Click Create.

Add a Mail Account

To get started, provide the following information:

The next window will give you a warning that Account must be manually configured. Click **Next**. The Next screen will ask for Account type. Select **POP**. In the incoming mail server type **mail.diodecom.net**, **username** (Example our email is email@diodecom.net, you will only type "email" and your email **password**. click **NEXT**.



In the Next Screen, the **Port** is **110**, **SSL** needs to be turn **off** and under Authentication select **password**.




Incoming Mail Server Info



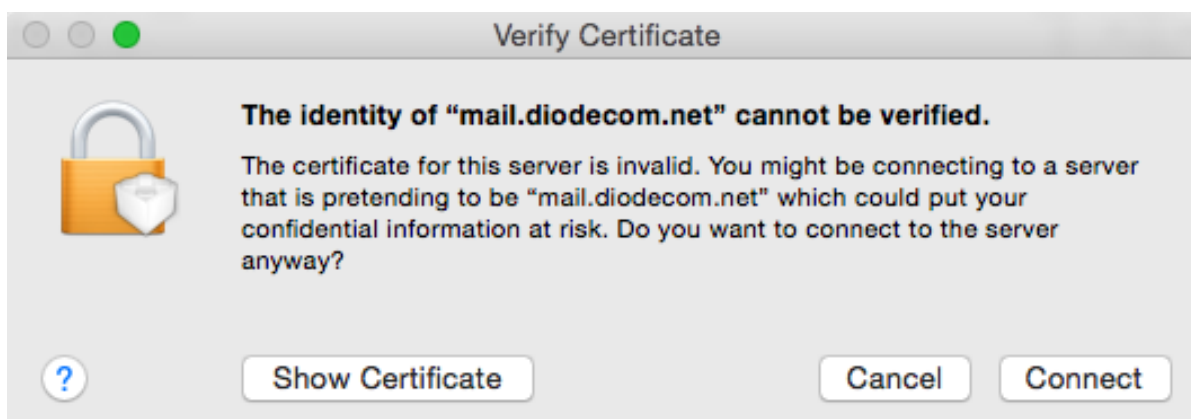

Outgoing mail Server the **Port** is **587**, **SSL** needs to be turn **off** and under Authentication select **password**.

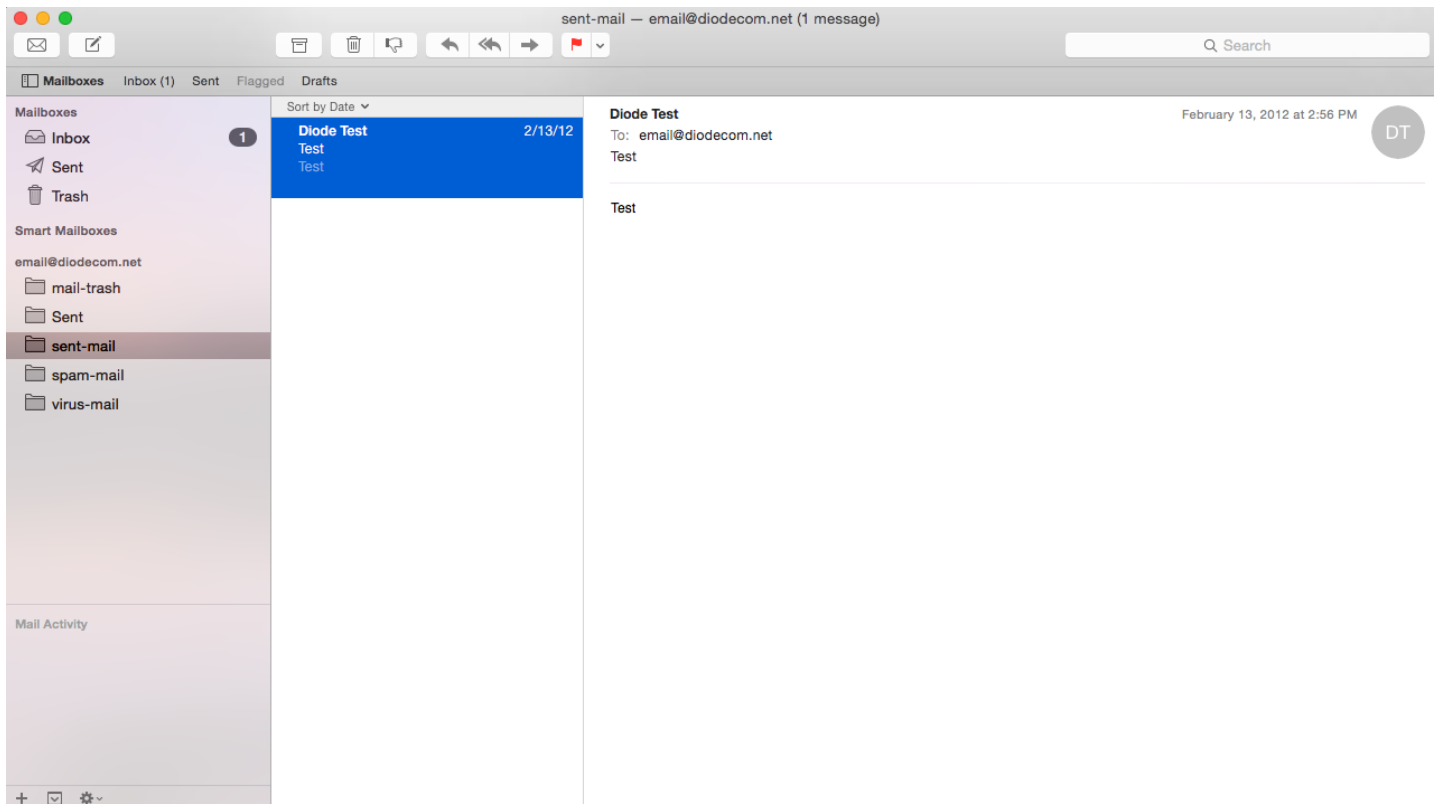
